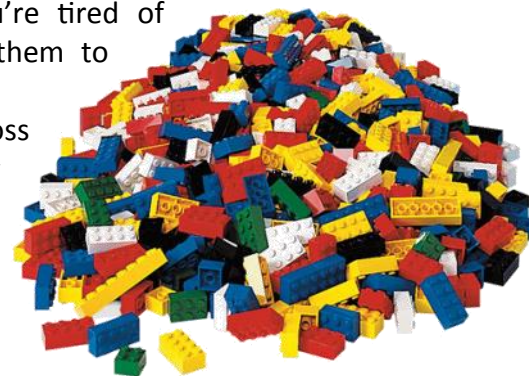

INTERLIBRARY LOANS

What are Interlibrary Loans (ILL)?

- ILLs are books that we do not own and therefore borrow from another library system (eg. Okanagan Regional Library System, Vancouver Public Library, Cariboo Regional District Library, etc.)

What May Be Borrowed?

- Hardback books published more than one year ago (we will consider purchasing new items)
- Photocopies of magazine and newspaper articles.
- Microfilm/fiche of genealogical materials
- Daisy CD's for the visually impaired
- DVD's

What May Not Be Borrowed

- Books published in the current year.
- Textbooks

What is the Cost?

- Free. However, there is a \$5.00 fee for items that are ordered in and not picked up.

How Long Before the Book Arrives

- It varies. If the book is owned by a library in the Kootenays and is on the shelf, it may take only a few days. Books from larger regional systems may take two to three weeks. We will inform you when the book arrives.

How Long Can the Book Be Kept?

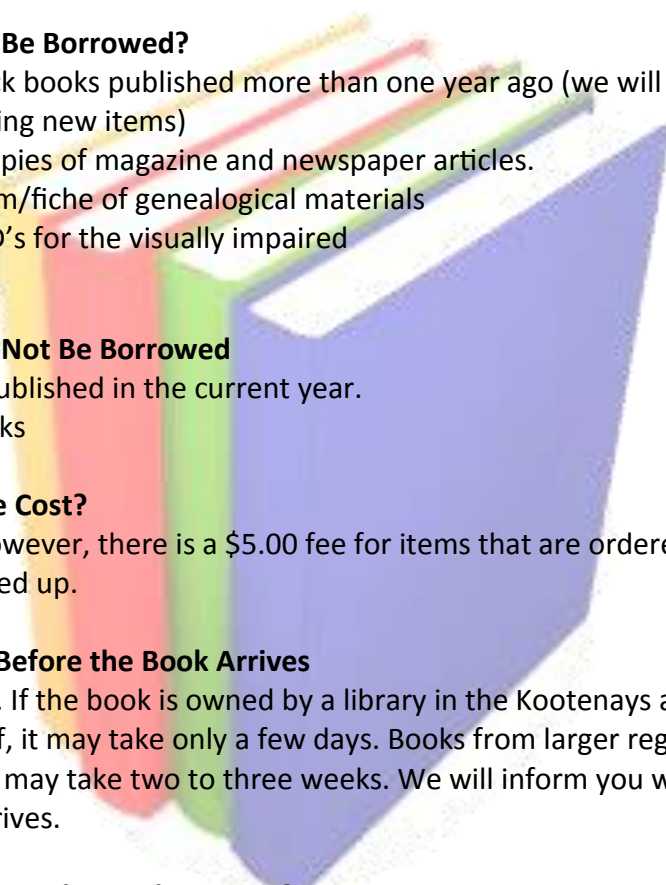
- Books may be kept for three weeks. You will be given a date due slip.

May the Book Be Renewed?

- We contact the lending library to ask for a renewal. Most BC public libraries allow one renewal.

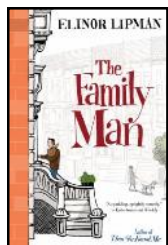
How Many Books May I Request?

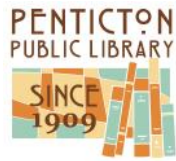
