

Friday April 17: Living the Dream Part IV as the Millards explore Central America from the Yucatan in Mexico, to Belize, Guatemala and Honduras.




April 27: The Girl Who Saved the King of Sweden by Jonas Jonasson

Jonasson, author of "The 100 Year Old Man Who Climbed Out the Window and Disappeared" introduces us to a cast of eccentrics: a nerve-damaged American Vietnam deserter, twin brothers who are officially only one person, three careless Chinese girls, an angry young woman, a potato growing baroness, the Swedish King and the prime minister. Quirky and utterly unique, "The Girl Who Saved the King of Sweden" is a charming and humorous account of one woman's unlikely adventure.

May 25: The Hotel on the Corner of Bitter & Sweet by Jamie Ford

When artifacts from Japanese families sent to internment camps during World War II are uncovered during renovations at a Seattle Hotel, Henry Lee embarks on a quest that leads to memories of growing up Chinese in a city rife with anti-Japanese sentiment.





June 29: The Storied Life of A.J. Fikry by Gabrielle Zevin

A. J. Fikry, the irascible owner of Island Books, has recently endured some tough years: his wife has died, his bookstore is experiencing the worst sales in its history, and his prized possession — a rare edition of Poe poems — has been stolen. Over time, he has given up on people, and even the books in his store, instead of offering solace, are yet another reminder of a world that is changing too rapidly until a most unexpected occurrence gives him the chance to make his life over and see things anew.
